## Year 11 University of Lincoln Trip

On Wednesday, several Year 11 students went to the University of Lincoln. The day started with some basic facts about life at university and how life at the University of Lincoln is. This was followed by a tour of the University campus where students got to go into different parts of the university; including the sports centre, the modern arts centre. As well as this, the students got to go into one of the largest buildings; The Isaac Newton Building.

After the tour had finished, everyone went into the largest lecture hall in the Isaac Newton building where a few activities took place. One of these activities was a course builder, where students had to choose 3 courses that the university delivers and give reasons as to why they would pick them, including gaining an understanding of the tariff point system.

### Proposed Uniform Change

CoPA has adopted polo shirts as part of a summer uniform for a number of years. We will continue to do this after the Easter break.

However, I am proposing that we do not move back to shirts and ties and change to polo shirts and jumpers permanently for the whole school year. Key stage 3 will continue to wear purple polo shirts with purple jumpers while KS4 will continue to wear black polos and jumpers.

Polos will be expected to be CoPA branded sourced from ChromaSports. All other aspects of the uniform will remain the same.
